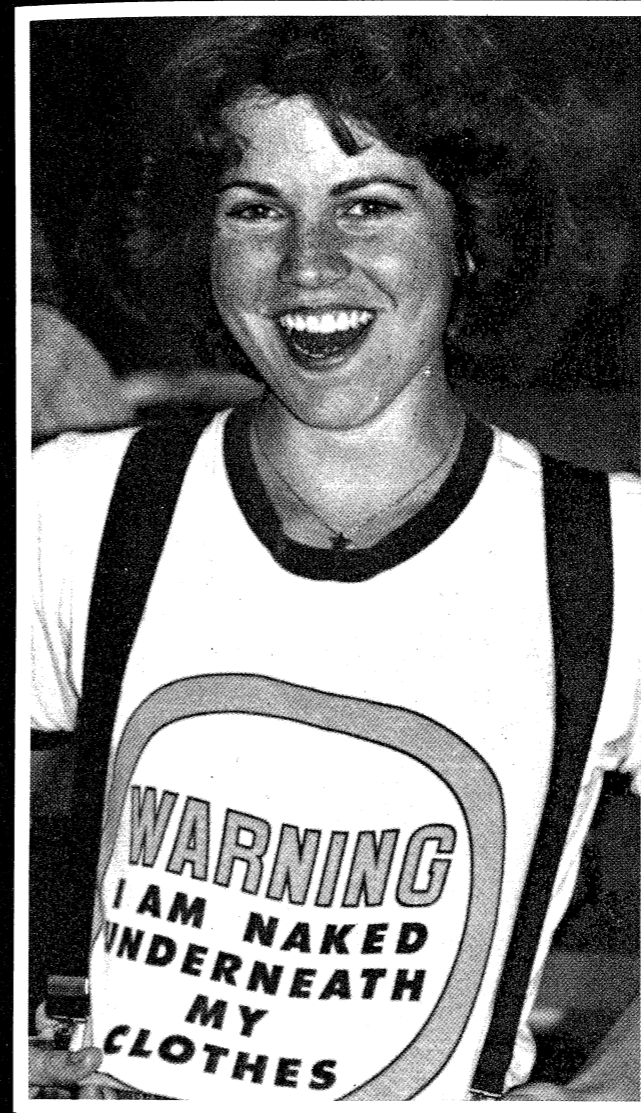
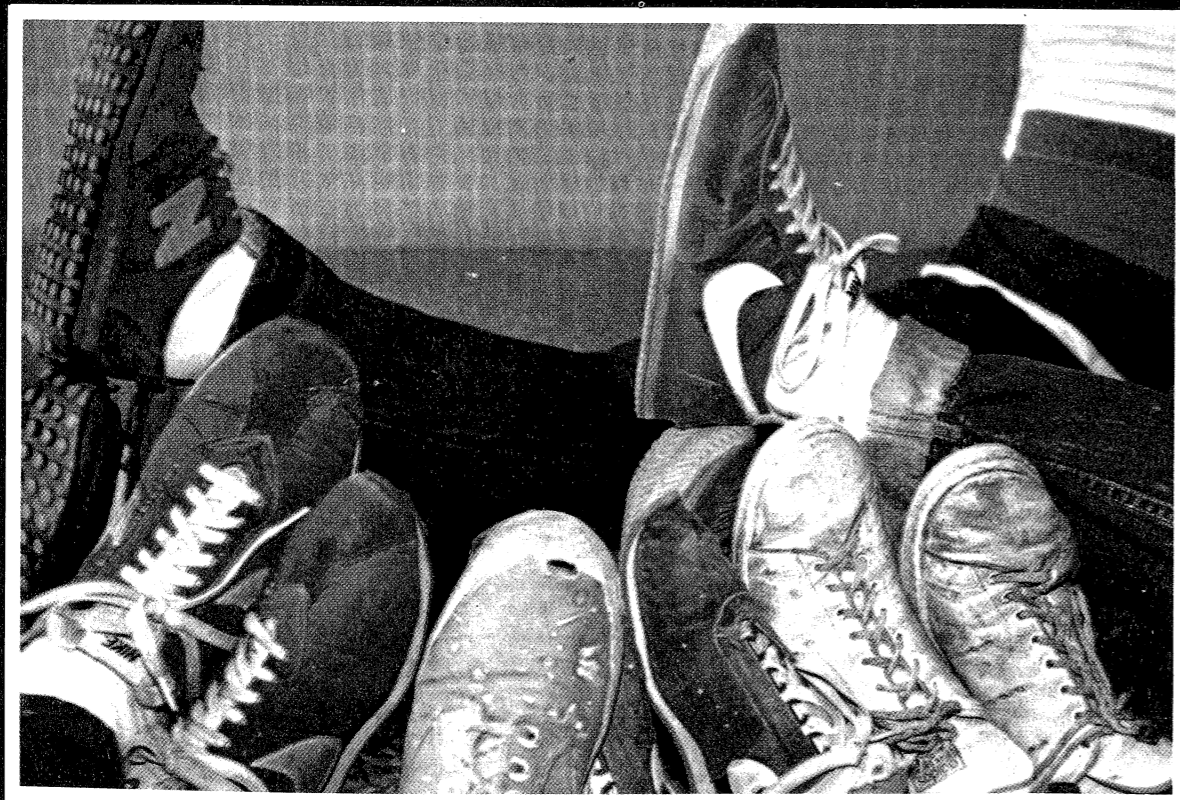
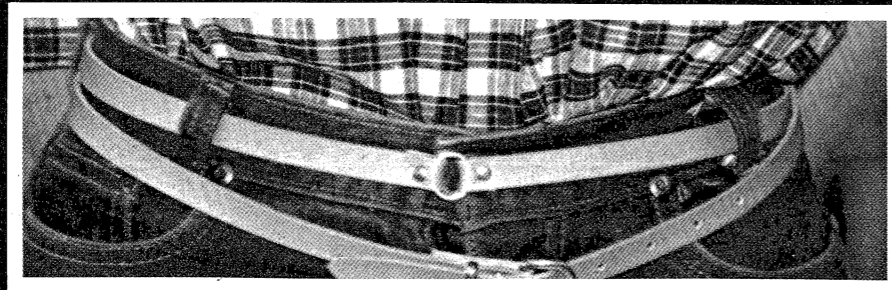
shining and new

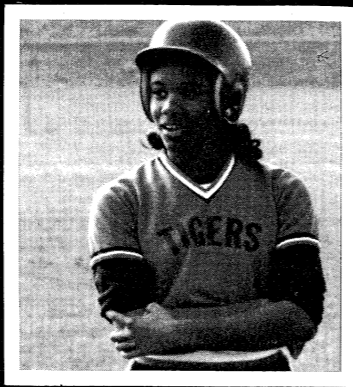


new rosemary award outstanding senior

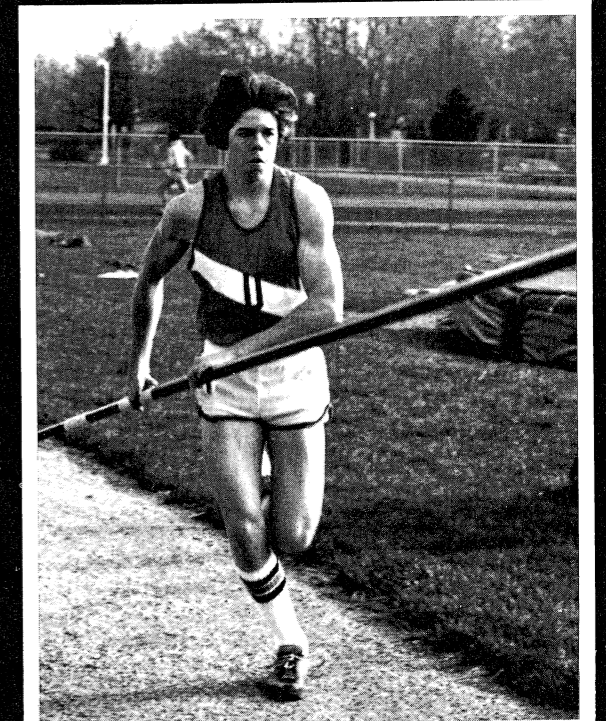
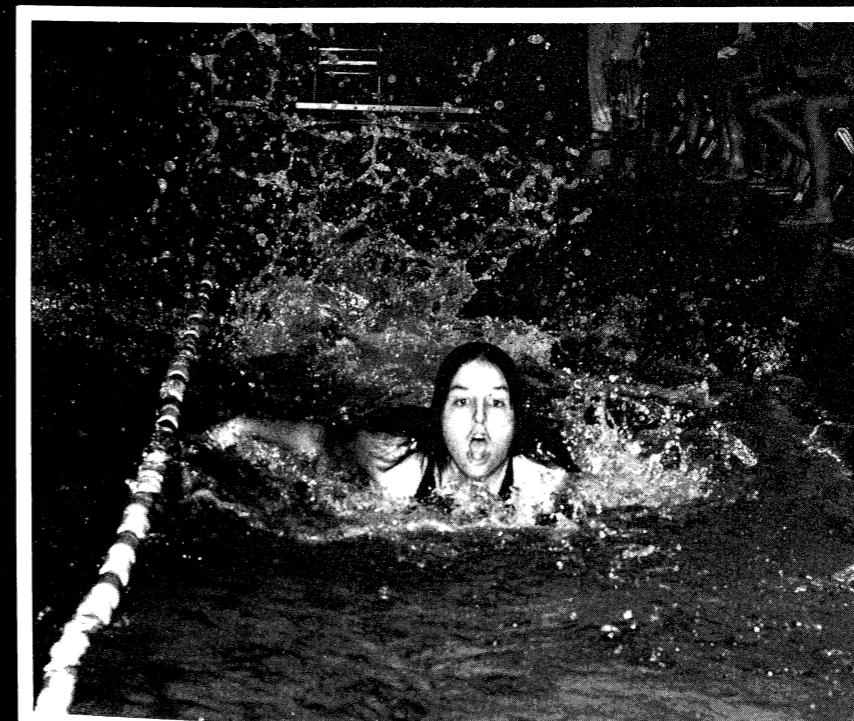
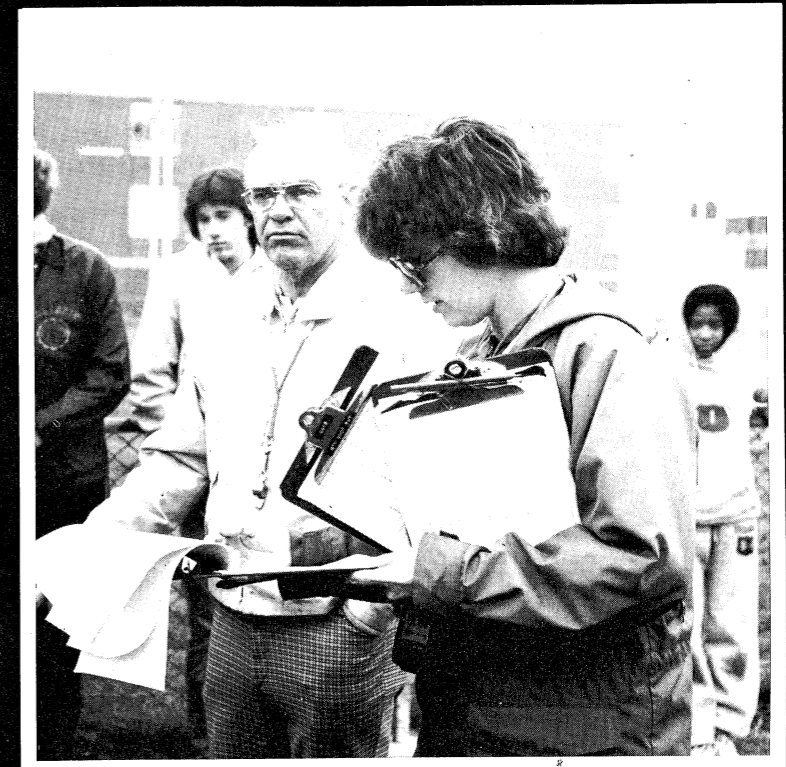
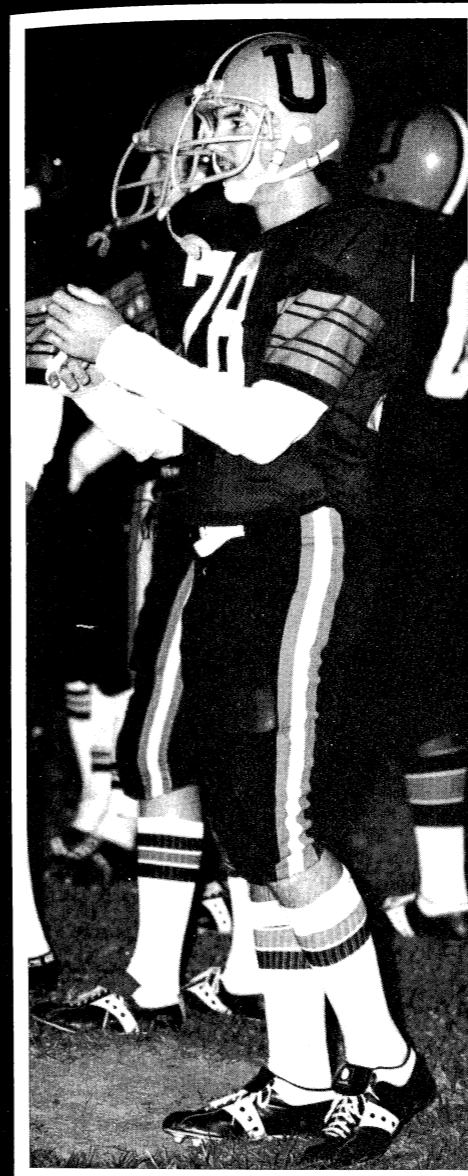

In his first year coaching the football team, J.C. Caroline turned Urbana to a 6-3 record. Led by captains Tracy Campbell, Tom Koertge, Frank Maxwell, and Mike Sommers, the Tigers began the season by defeating Rantoul 30-13. Danville then turned the tables and dominated Urbana 30-13. Urbana devastated the Lincoln Hillsplitters 31-0 at Homecoming. At the season's end, the Tigers sneaked past arch rival Champaign Central 13-12, and claimed the Wright Street Trophy for the 3rd straight year. Murray Kirby and Joe Lard are honored as the best offensive and defensive players, and Martin Maehr was honored as the most improved player. In addition, Kirby, Maxwell, Koertge, Lard, and Sommers were named to the All-Big-12 football team.

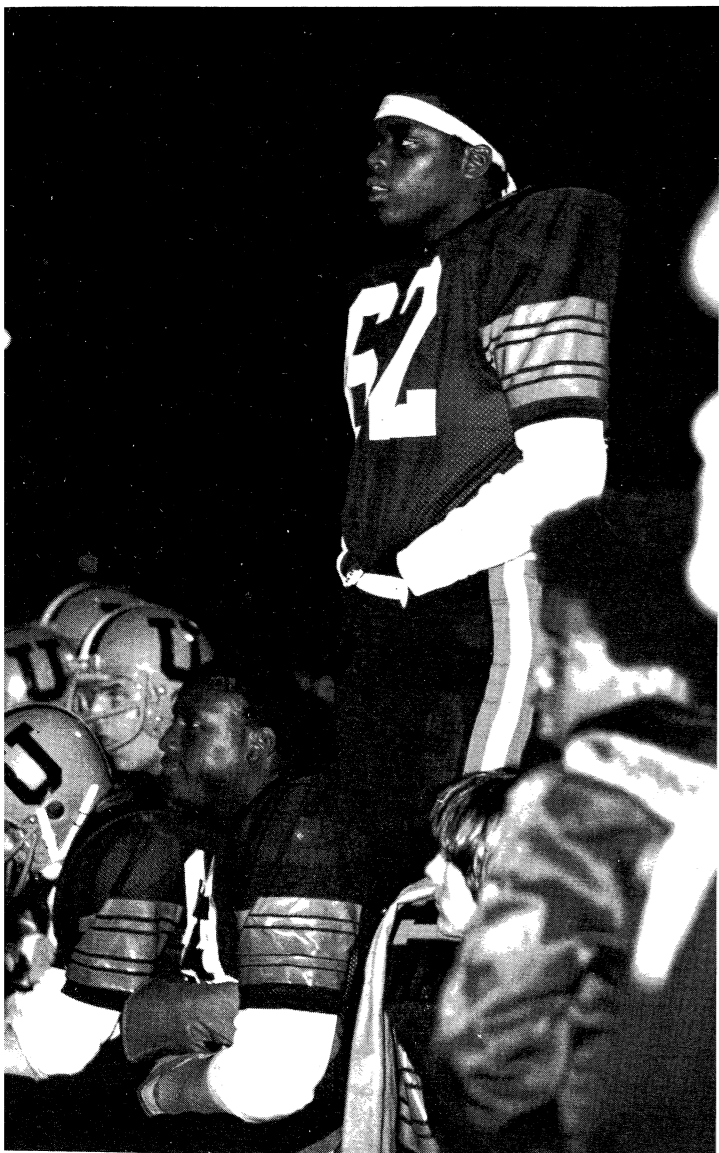

Seniors David Eskew, Paul Franke, Robert Meador and John Thies led the 1979 Urbana harriers to a 6-5 record. Top runner Franke succumbed to mononucleosis early in the season and his absence hurt the harriers. Urbana placed 4th at the conference meet and 7th at district. Meador's good performance at district advanced him to sectionals where he placed 22nd. The year ended with a banquet where Thies was honored as the most valuable runner, and Sam Batzli was honored as the most improved runner. 1979 was the first year for girls' cross country at Urbana. Because other teams had so few runners, most girls' meets were not scored. But the district meet was scored, and there Urbana placed 2nd. Everyone on the team lettered, and five girls qualified for state at the season's end.

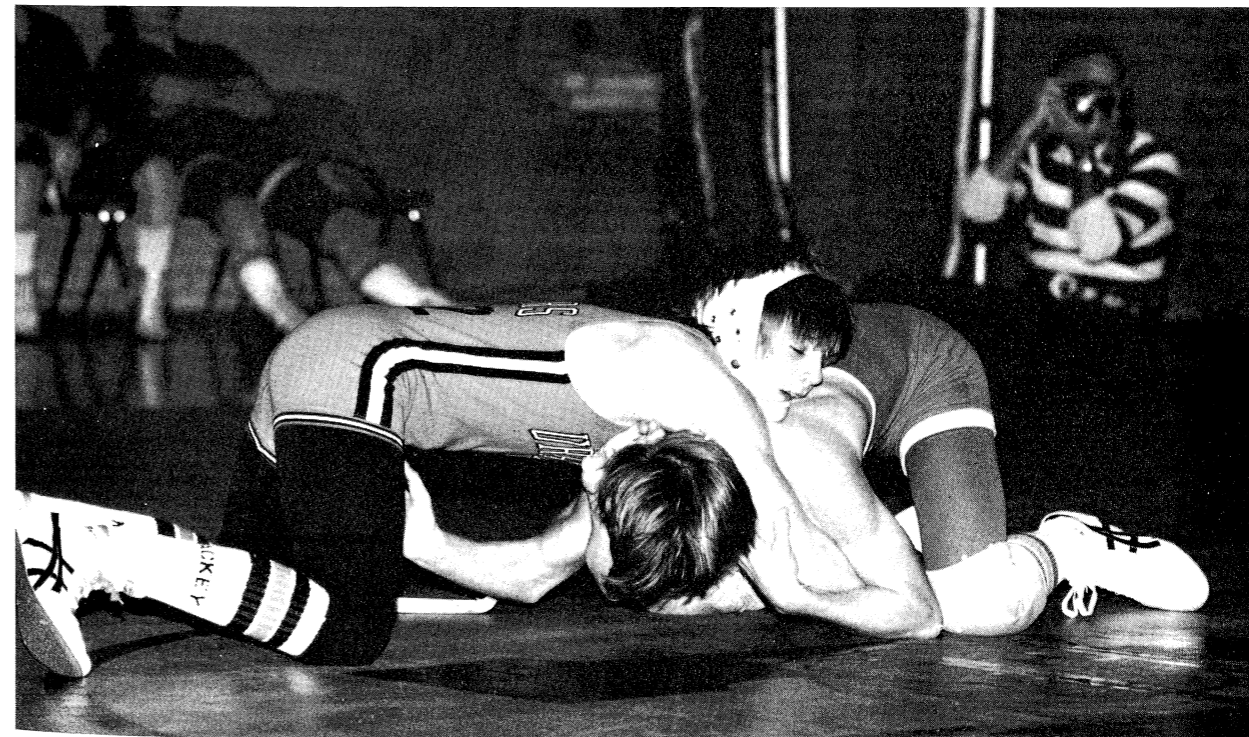
Wrestlers on top again

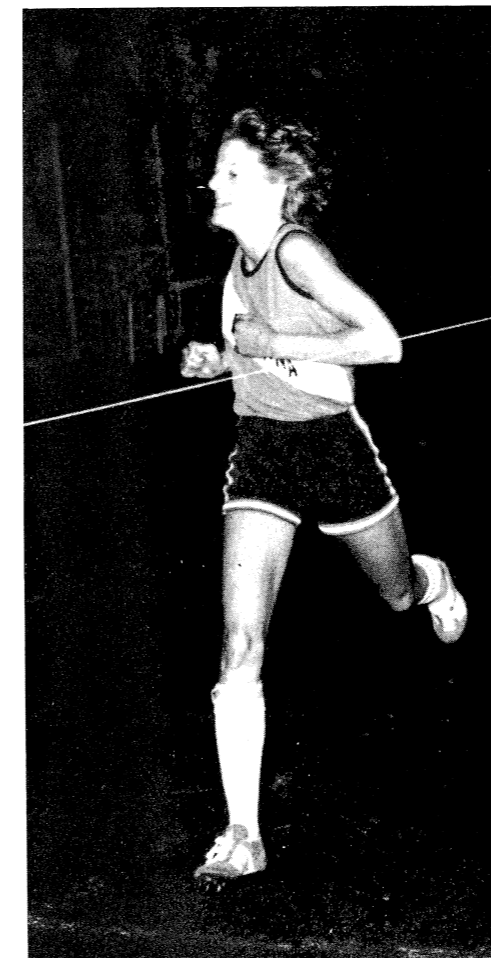
